Maintenance and Engineering Technician Apprenticeship

ABP's Maintenance and Engineering Technician Apprenticeship will focus on the core principles of mechanical and/or electrical maintenance, teaching essential fundamental skills that will be transferable regardless of the engineering sector.

Depending on your assigned job role, your apprenticeship could focus on either electrical or mechanical engineering.

It will cover the operational requirements of modern, integrated, engineered plants and services (plant & equipment, electrical systems & process control, and electromechanical).

This apprenticeship will take up to 4 years. The apprenticeship programme allows you to become a well-rounded, knowledgeable technician, you will gain the expertise, training and competency to carry out the mechanical and electrical side of the job.

Functional Apprenticeship

Supporting the Operation Teams who handle handle multiple cargo types imported to, or exported from, the UK, such as cars, food, manufactured goods and raw materials.

Commercial

Business to Business sales professional is a multi-faceted role, using insights, critical thinking, and commercial judgement to deliver benefits and customer satisfaction through the sales process. This apprenticeship will take 3 years.

Credit Control

Credit management and collections are rewarding career choices for self-motivated and enthusiastic individuals who would enjoy a varied role working at the centre of operations. Roles are typically fast-paced and target driven, requiring detailed knowledge of law, regulations and the business environment. This apprenticeship will take 12 months.

Human Resources

Business administrators have a highly transferable set of skills and behaviours. The role may involve working independently or as part of a team developing, implementing, maintaining and improving administrative services. This Apprenticeship will take 18 months.

Marine Operations Officer Apprenticeship


ABP's Marine Operations

We may ask you to complete some online assessments, a telephone interview or an online assessment day.

We recommend that you prepare well and keep our top tips in mind!

Tip 1: For the application

Read the job description carefully and remember to explain how you meet the requirements. Mention all relevant achievements. Tell us about your career aspirations and why you're the right match for ABP.

Tip 2: For the telephone interview

Make sure you find a quiet place to conduct the interview where you won't be disturbed. If you are using a mobile phone, make sure you have good network coverage and your battery is going to last. Research ABP and make sure you prepare as much as possible. We want to hear about you, so think about when you've solved a problem, taken the lead or shown initiative. Ask questions.

Tip 3: For the assessment centre/interview

Speak up! If you don't contribute, we can't get to know you. Prepare! Understand the business area that you want to move into. Relax! There are no trick questions and we want you to be the best you can be.
